Leisenring finished his career as the highest scoring Vermont-born player in school history and ranks 25th on the all-time scoring list with 46 goals and 71 assists for 117 points. He finished this past season second on the team in scoring with 11 goals and 24 assists for 35 points. He was also named the Hockey East Player of the Month in October and on two occasions was named the Hockey East Player of the Week.

The Catamounts finished the 2005-06 season at 18-14-6 and had the best start in school history beginning the year 7-0.

The Barons, the AHL affiliate of the San Jose Sharks, take on the Hamilton Bulldogs tomorrow night at 7:30pm. Leisenring will continue his education at UVM and is on pace to graduate this spring.
